## **Highlights**

- The weekly average New York State regular gasoline retail price increased \$0.021/gallon (0.8%) since last week to \$2.752/gallon. Current prices are \$0.239/gallon (8.0%) below the year-ago price of \$2.991/gallon.
- Mid-Atlantic gasoline inventories increased 1.8 million barrels (5.7%) since last week to 32.7 million barrels. Inventories are 9.4% below the year-ago level but 10.7% above the 5-year average.
- Mid-Atlantic ultra-low sulfur (ULS) distillate inventories decreased 0.6 million barrels (2.7%) since last week to 20.5 million barrels. Inventories are 7.6% below the year-ago level and 20.4% below the 5-year average.

## **Retail Prices**

Prices are from the "AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report."

**Regular Gasoline**— For the week ending September 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2019, the New York State weekly retail gasoline price averaged \$2.752/gallon, an increase of \$0.021/gallon (0.8%) from last week's average of \$2.731/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$2.991/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$0.239/gallon (8.0%).

The all-time high of \$4.309/gallon occurred on July 9<sup>th</sup>, 2008.

**Diesel**— For the week ending on September 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2019, the New York State weekly retail diesel price averaged \$3.167/gallon, an increase of \$0.018/gallon (0.6%) from last week's average of \$3.149/gallon. Compared to the year earlier price of \$3.329/gallon, the statewide average has decreased \$0.162/gallon (4.9%).

The all-time high of 5.138/gallon occurred on June 18<sup>th</sup>, 2008.


## **Crude Oil Spot Prices**



WTI – For the week ending September 20<sup>th</sup>, 2019, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$59.33/bbl, an increase of \$3.17/bbl (5.6%) from the week-ago average of \$56.16/bbl. WTI prices are now \$10.95/bbl (15.6%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$70.28/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred the week ending July 4<sup>th</sup>, 2008.

**Brent** - For the week ending September 20<sup>th</sup>, 2019, Brent crude oil spot prices averaged \$65.56/bbl, an increase of \$2.82/bbl (4.5%) from the week-ago





average of \$62.74/bbl. Brent prices are now \$13.41/bbl (17.0%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$78.97/bbl.

The all-time weekly average high of \$141.07/bbl occurred the week ending July 4th, 2008.
